Subject to the following conditions:

1. **The importer accept the sole responsibility of ensuring that ALL the conditions below have been complied with and understands his responsibility in this regard.**
2. The consignment must be accompanied by **ORIGINAL** this permit;
3. The animals must be tested and found free of the diseases indicated and the health certificate overleaf, consisting of **two pages** must be completed and signed by an authorised veterinary official who must also **inform the state veterinarian at destination of the dispatch of the animals by means of a fax.**
4. The arrival of the consignment must be reported to the State Veterinarian, **GOBABIS**
Telephone **062- 562441/ fax 062-563533** immediately and the animals may not be landed without his/her authorization.
5. In the case of cattle, the importer undertakes to have the animals branded with a special mark () ~~before~~ before the animals enter Namibia. All animals will be tagged with a specific tag for imported animals. The farmer further undertakes to maintain registers of all imported animals as prescribed. **The farm of destination will remain in closed until all the conditions on this permit have been met.**
6. **To account for the welfare of the animals, heavily pregnant cows (past 90% of pregnancy) and animals born within 7 days of intended import, will NOT be allowed to be transported.**
7. The cattle must be moved directly to the farm of destination in Namibia, and must remain on the farm for a period of at least 90 (ninety) days.
8. The farm of destination will remain closed for a period of 40 (forty) days after arrival of the cattle, during which inspections will be carried out by Directorate of Veterinary Services. Any tests required during this period will be for the owner's account.
9. This permit is valid is for one consignment only.

B HEALTH ATTESTATION

I, the undersigned veterinary official authorised thereto by the official veterinary authority of..... (name of country) certify that:

- 1. The animals described in A:
 - 1.1. Were born and reared in Botswana;
 - 1.2. Originate from an OIE recognised Foot and Mouth Disease and Contagious Bovine PleuroPneumonia free zone, **excluding zone 4A**, where vaccination is not practised.
 - 1.3. Originate from premises at least 100 kilometres removed from any place where Vesicular Stomatitis or Foot-and- Mouth Disease has occurred within the preceding 12 months;
 - 1.4. Were not vaccinated against Foot and Mouth Disease;
 - 1.5. Originate from herds which are healthy and clinically free from Johne's disease, Rabies, Brucellosis, Tuberculosis Leptospirosis; Campylobacteriosis, Trichomoniasis and Bovine Viral Diarrhoea and have no history of Enzootic Bovine Leucosis;
 - 2. The country of origin is free from BSE.
 - 3. The individual animals:
 - 3.1. Were examined by an official veterinarian of the country of export **on the day of departure** and were found clinically free from signs of FMD and other diseases to which bovines are susceptible and free from external parasites;
 - 3.2. Have never been vaccinated against Foot and Mouth Disease and Contagious Bovine PleuroPneumonia.
 - 3.3. Have not been exposed to infection to which they are susceptible within 30 days before exportation;
 - 3.4. Have been vaccinated against Anthrax in the last 12 months
 - 4. **The animals were** tested for the following diseases with negative results (**Copies of laboratory results must be attached**)
 - 4.1. The intra-dermal tuberculin test with both mammalian and avian tuberculin between 30 and 60 days prior to export. **DATE(s) OF TEST**.....
 - 4.2. The serum virus neutralisation test for the presence of antibodies against Infectious bovine rhinotracheitis/Infectious pustular vulvovaginitis virus group; **OR** the herd must be clinically free from IBR/IPV and the animals to be exported vaccinated against IBR/IPV with an inactivated vaccine approved by the exporting country (vaccination date to be stipulated);
 - 4.3. The agar gel immunodiffusion test for Enzootic Bovine Leukosis on a blood sample within 6 weeks prior to exportation;
 - 4.4. The complement fixation test for brucellosis within **30 days** prior to export.
NOTE: Female animals under the age of 3 years which have been inoculated with strain 19 Brucella abortus bovis vaccine at the ages of 3 to 8 months will be accepted without prior testing

4.5. In case of breeding bulls, a clinical and laboratory examination for Vibriosis and Trichomoniasis;

Animals originating from heartwater areas were treated for ticks with (name of product) within 72 hours of departure. (This must be verified by the veterinary official)

- 5. The animals were branded with the following mark in compliance with clause 5 of the import permit.
- 6. The animals were loaded and transported in clean vehicles/containers which are suitable for transport of the species concerned. The vehicles were sealed under official supervision.
- 7. All bedding, fodder or other feedstuffs for the animals emanate from areas not under any restrictions due to Foot and Mouth Disease.
